The Earth as a system is facing several environmental challenges on a global scale, so-called "Grand Challenges". The growing population needs fresh air and water, good food and energy. However, humankind is not meeting these needs. The major environmental challenges include climate change, declining air quality, ocean acidification, loss of biodiversity and shortages of fresh water and food supplies. The Grand Challenges are the main factors controlling human well-being, security and stability of future societies. A common framework of scientists and the society is needed to be able to deliver a science based message to governments to be legitimated for fast tract policy making. Church has a focal role in this initiative. To answer the Grand Challenges and to avoid a collapse of Earth system, the mankind has only a 40-year window (Earth System Manifesto: https://www.atm.helsinki.fi/peex/images/manifesti peex ru hub2.pdf). The Sofia Earth Forum aims at joint understanding over different boundaries and at finding practical solutions on the Grand Challenges, especially in the Northern context.
